Statement of Need

Health disparities adversely affect groups of people who have systematically experienced greater obstacles to health based on their racial or ethnic group; religion; socioeconomic status; gender; age; mental health; cognitive, sensory, or physical disability; sexual orientation or gender identity; geographic location; or other characteristics historically linked to discrimination or exclusion. According to the National Institute of Health, health disparities deserve particular attention not only because they are avoidable, but because they are unfair and unjust. To reflect the latest public health priorities, Healthy People 2030 focused an overarching goal to "eliminate health disparities, achieve health equity, and attain health literacy to improve the health and well-being of all." Achieving health equity requires valuing everyone equally with focused and ongoing societal efforts to address avoidable inequalities, historical and contemporary injustices, and social determinants of health — and to eliminate disparities in health and health care. In order to achieve these goals, we need to ensure every person has the opportunity to attain their full health potential and no one is disadvantaged from achieving this potential because of social position or other socially determined circumstances. This summit will highlight the root causes of health disparities and establish solutions to promote and achieve health equity.

Who Should Attend

Physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, registered nurses, social workers, counselors, register dieticians, health educators, pharmacists, educators/teachers, first responders, drug court, law enforcement, peer support specialists, and any professional interested in gaining knowledge on health disparities and solutions to achieve health equality in Alabama.

• Debate awareness & understanding of health disparities and their underlying causes and ethical implications.
